	<b>Answer</b> : The majority of capitalised costs associated with development of Govt Kaehne well (item 2.1(d)) were paid in Q1-20. Operating costs (item 1.9) are likely to be lower in Q2-20 due to fields being shut in and corporate overheads being reduced.

Answer: Options are being considered by the Board with management in discussions with the Company's US lender. Sale of US production assets is a consideration for the company.

	Does the entity expect to be able to continue its operations and to meet its business objectives and, if so, on what basis?
Answer	The significant decrease in global oil demand as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and the increase in supply from Russia and Saudi Arabia in March has seen an unprecedented decrease in oil price in April 2020. This, along with the shut-in of a significant number of producing wells, has had a severe impact on the Company's revenue generation capacity.
	The company is working with its bankers to determine what action, if any, can be taken to remain compliant with the loan. The value of the company's production assets are currently below the amount of the loan that is provided as security for this facility.
	It is unlikely that the Company will be able to meet its previous oil and gas production business objectives at this time. The Company will continue to focus its resources and efforts on other exploration opportunities associated with the hard-rock battery minerals and hydrocarbon leaseholds that it owns.
